## 1. Paper I: General Ability and Intelligence

**Type:** Objective (Multiple-Choice Questions)

**Total Marks:** 250

**Duration:** 2 hours

This paper tests the candidate's general awareness and reasoning ability. It is divided into the following sections:

### (i) General Mental Ability

- Logical reasoning
- Quantitative aptitude
- Numerical ability
- Data interpretation

### (ii) General Science

- General awareness of scientific phenomena
- Developments in science and technology
- Environmental issues and climate change

### (iii) Current Events of National and International Importance

- Current affairs related to political, social, and economic developments
- Indian culture and arts
- Sports
- Global developments (e.g., geopolitical changes, treaties, summits)

### (iv) Indian Polity and Economy

- Indian Constitution
- Political system and governance
- Public administration

- Economic development, reforms, and policies
- Social systems and human rights issues

**(v) History of India**

- Freedom struggle
- Key events, dates, and movements
- Contributions of significant leaders

**(vi) Indian and World Geography**

- Physical and economic geography
  - Social and demographic aspects of India

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**2. Paper II: General Studies, Essay, and Comprehension**

**Type:** Descriptive

**Total Marks:** 200

**Duration:** 3 hours

This paper evaluates the candidate's writing ability, analytical skills, and comprehension. It is divided into two parts:

**Part A: Essay Writing (80 Marks)**

- Essays in English or Hindi (medium of the essay must match the language chosen for the paper).
- Topics typically cover:
  - Security challenges and strategies
  - Socio-political and economic issues
  - Geopolitics
  - Environmental concerns
  - Cultural and historical aspects

## Part B: Comprehension, Precis Writing, and Grammar (120 Marks)

- Reading comprehension passages with related questions
  - Precis writing
  - Usage of grammar and vocabulary
  - Developing coherent and logical answers
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### 3. Physical Efficiency Test (PET) & Medical Standards

Candidates who qualify the written examination are required to undergo physical tests. The PET consists of:
