General SLET Exam Structure

The SLET exam is divided into **two papers**:

Paper I: General Paper on Teaching and Research Aptitude
Paper II: Subject-specific Paper (based on the subject chosen by the candidate)

Paper I: General Paper on Teaching and Research Aptitude

This paper is common for all candidates, irrespective of the subject chosen. It assesses general knowledge and teaching/research aptitude.
